

Audi driving experience – COVID 19 information

The safety of our customers and staff is our top priority. To ensure we can host this event safely we will follow all public health guidance and comply with current government regulations.

Audi driving experience will proceed under [alert level 1](#), and [alert level 2](#). If Auckland is operating under [alert levels 3 or 4](#), the event will be cancelled. In the event that Audi driving experience is cancelled, we will look to select a suitable date to reschedule. Customers will also have the option be refunded for the entire ticket price. Please refer to the cancellation policy in our [terms and conditions](#) for more information.

How will the event operate under alert level 2?

The following measures will be implemented to minimise the participant's risk of exposure to covid-19:

- Participants experiencing cold and flu like symptoms will be unable to take place in the event.
- Participants will be limited to small groups of 10 or less.
- Organisers and participants to practice physical distancing per government recommendations.
- Vehicles will be sanitised between use.
- PPE and face coverings will be encouraged to align with government requirements.
- Hand sanitiser will be available at the event for participant use.
- Any shared spaces are cleaned regularly.
- Customers and guests will be required to sign in on arrival for contact tracing measures.

How will the event operate under alert level 1?

The following measures will be implemented to minimise the participant's risk of exposure to covid-19:

- Participants experiencing cold and flu like symptoms will be unable to take place in the event.
- Hand sanitiser will be available at the event for participant use.
- Any shared spaces are cleaned regularly.
- Customers and guests will be required to sign in on arrival for contact tracing measures.

What happens if I am feeling unwell on the day?

Participants will not be able to take part in the event if they are experiencing any cold and flu-like symptoms.

- A high temperature. (At least 38°C)
- Coughing, Sneezing,
- Sore throat
- Breathing problems,
- Shortness of breath

If you or any of your family members have been in contact with someone who is in the process of being tested or has tested positive for COVID-19, we kindly ask that you stay home. Please let us know and we can advise what your options are.
